

After boarding, spend free time exploring, or join our "welcome walk" to stretch your legs and get oriented. (D)</p> <p><b>DAY 2</b>  Passau, Germany  Today you will take a walking tour of this elegant town, called the Dreiflüssestadt ("City on Three Rivers"), which is situated at the confluence of the Danube, Ilz and Inn Rivers. You'll see the New Bishop's Residence and visit the impressive baroque St. Stephen's Cathedral with its ornate interior. Inside, you are treated to a special concert played on the 17,000-pipe organ, considered Europe's largest</p>

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church organ. This afternoon, you are free to explore Passau. See the sights and experience the local culture, or simply relax aboard your ship before departure. (B, L, D)

#### DAY 3

Linz, Austria

Arrive in Linz this morning and set off on an all-day excursion to the beautiful Bohemian town of Český Krumlov, a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Ride through the scenic Czech countryside and take a walking tour featuring the lovely historic center of the city with many baroque and Renaissance buildings, dating back hundreds of years. You have some free time to enjoy Krumlov's charming streets, filled with cafés, shops, galleries and pubs. Maybe stop for lunch in one of the many local restaurants. Return for dinner and a late-evening departure. (B, D)

#### DAY 4

Krems, Austria

Today's highlight is an exclusive visit of the splendid Benedictine Abbey of Göttweig, a working monastery for more than 900 years. You can choose to begin your day with visit to the beautiful Melk Abbey, followed by a scenic drive through the Wachau Valley to Dürnstein. Onboard amenities include free Wi-Fi access, serene and elegant public spaces, elevators, a Sun Deck with 360-degree views and shaded sitting area; even an organic herb garden, putting green, and walking track!</p> <p>The Aquavit Terrace is a revolutionary indoor/outdoor viewing area at the bow of the ship with grills for al fresco dining.</p>

In 2000, the company purchased Europe's KD River Cruises in order to grow its fleet, to leverage 40 years of river cruising experience and to acquire rights to prime docking locations in key European cities.</p> <p>The company expanded into the American market in 2000, establishing US headquarters in Los Angeles, California. Through rapid expansion, the company has grown to be The World's Leading River Cruise Line, with double-digit growth in recent years. And with the launch of its ocean fleet in 2015, the company has also become the leader in small ship ocean cruising.</p> <p>With operational headquarters in Basel, Switzerland, Viking provides destination-focused itineraries designed for experienced travelers who have an interest in geography, culture and history. Each journey includes a shore excursion in every port, and an exclusive Viking Culture Curriculum program that provides deep immersion in the destination through performances of music and art, cooking demonstrations, informative port talks and carefully selected guest lecturers.</p>

Four more yet-to-be-named ships are scheduled to launch by 2023.</p> <p>The company's award-winning ships are engineered at a size that allows direct access into most ports, so guests have easy and efficient embarkation and disembarkation.
