Location	short holiday. Las Vegas is situated in the far south of the state of Nevada, in Western USA, close to the Arizona and California border.
Geography	The city is in an arid basin surrounded by dry mountains. City elevation is around 620 m above sea level. The Spring Mountains lie to the west. As befits a desert, much of the landscape is rocky and dusty. Within the city, however, there are a great deal of lawns, trees, and other greenery. Due to water resource issues, there is now a movement to encourage xeriscapes instead of lawns.



Name	In the 1800s, areas of the Las Vegas Valley contained artesian wells that supported extensive green areas or meadows (vegas in Spanish),
	hence the name Las Vegas.
Population	Las Vegas is the 28th most populous city in the United States with a population of 560,000. The population of the Las Vegas metropolitan area is just under 2 million.
Language	English
Currency	The US Dollar. Currently (Oct 2013) the Canadian dollar is close to parity.
Tipping	Tips are a very important part of certain workers' income, and gratuities are the standard way of showing appreciation for services provided. In hotels, tip bellhops at least \$1 per bag (\$2-\$3 if you have a lot of luggage) and tip the chamber staff \$1 to \$2 per day (more if you've left a disaster area for him or her to clean up). Tip the doorman or concierge only if he or she has provided you with some specific service (for example, calling a cab for you or obtaining difficult-to-get theater tickets). Tip the valet-parking attendant \$1 to \$2 every time you get your car. In restaurants, bars, and nightclubs, tip service staff 15% to 20% of the check, tip bartenders 10% to 15%, tip checkroom attendants \$1 per garment, and tip valet-parking attendants \$1 per vehicle. As for other service personnel, tip cab drivers 15% of the fare; tip skycaps at airports at least \$1 per bag (\$2-\$3 if you have a lot of luggage); and tip hairdressers and barbers 15% to 20%.

Bootimentation	to the US, so remember to apply for one well in advance of your trip; if you have a passport already, don't forget to check the expiry date and renew well ahead of time if necessary.

Health	Although it's not required of travelers, health insurance is highly recommended in the US for Canadian visitors. Most health insurance policies cover you if you get sick away from home - but check your coverage before you leave. Vacationers should note that the United States does not usually offer free or low-cost medical care to its citizens or visitors. Doctors and hospitals are expensive, and in most cases will require advance payment or proof of coverage before they render their services. Medical facilities in the city are excellent.
Safety tips	Las Vegas, first and foremost, is a metropolitan area that has all of the
	safety issues that any large city must cope with. That said, Las Vegas is also a city unlike any other in that so many of the day-to-day transactions involved with the primary commerce of Las Vegas: gambling. With the huge amounts of cash come additional threats to ones safety. While casinos and hotels have a strong interest in making



sure patrons are safe and secure, it is paramount to keep in mind that an individual's safety depends on being aware of his or her environment. Counting your money as you walk down the Strip, for example, is one sure way to attract unwanted attention. Avoid discussing your room number loudly in public; you don't want to advertise where you will be taking that latest jackpot. Try to remember all of the things you would do in your hometown to stay safe, such as avoiding walking to your car alone at night or flashing large amounts of cash in public, and you should be fine. If you are lucky and score a big win, think about taking your winnings in a check rather than as cash; if you must have cash, feel free to request a security escort to your car or room; most casino hotels are more than willing to help their guests feel secure. When you are in public, always be aware of your belongings, particularly when you are playing at the tables or at a slot machine; purse snatchings and pickpocketing are some of the most common crimes.

CLIMATE	
General climate	Las Vegas' climate is an arid, desert climate, typical of the Mojave Desert in which it lies. The city enjoys abundant sunshine year-round and has about an average of 300 sunshine days a year, with very little rainfall. The summer months of June through September are very hot and mostly dry with average daytime highs of 34°C-40 °C and nighttime lows of 21°C-26 °C; and most days in July and August exceed 38°C but with very low humidity, frequently under 10%. Las Vegas' winters are of short duration and the season is generally mild, with daytime highs near 16°C and nighttime lows around 4 °C. The mountains surrounding Las Vegas accumulate snow during the winter but snow is rare in the Las Vegas Valley itself.
Today's weather	36 Centigrade and sunny all day (as at 12 th October 2013)
Best time to visit	Spring and fall offer the best temperatures, but Las Vegas is truly a year round destination.

Diatanaa	areas with more than 1,000 slot machines. Bell Trans (www.bell-trans.com) runs 20-passenger minibuses daily between the airport and all major Las Vegas hotels and motels (7:45am-midnight). Several other companies run similar ventures - just stand outside on the curb and one will be flagged down for you. Buses from the airport leave about every 10 minutes. When you want to check out of your hotel and head back to the airport, call at least 2 hours in advance to be safe. The cost is \$5 per person each way to Strip- and Convention Center-area hotels, \$6.50 to Downtown or other Off-Strip properties. Other similarly priced shuttles run 24 hours and can be found in the same place.
Distances	Vegas is 460kms from Phoenix, 1200kms from Denver, 670kms from Salt Lake City, 430kms from Los Angeles, and 940kms from San Francisco.
Vegas – The Strip	Exploring The Strip takes time, reasonable temperatures and good walking shoes. Fortunately, the last time I visited we had all three. Spring sunshine illuminated the seven kilometer stretch of Las Vegas Boulevard known as The Strip which is home to all the big name resorts, the entertainments and of course the casinos. From the Burmese themed Mandalay Bay at the southern end to the CN Tower kindred spirit, the Stratosphere at the northern end, The Strip is a pulsating ribbon of erupting volcanoes, dancing fountains and pirate ship attacks. Where else could the Statue of Liberty (New York, New York) look toward a golden pyramid (Luxor) and be over-shadowed by the Eifel Tower (Paris)? Where else could you take your loved one a gondola ride through the Venetian canals being serenaded by a gondolier? (Well, in Venice Italy actuallybut you get the gist). By night, the neon burns brightly, brashly and there's a barely contained exuberance about the crowded sidewalks. It's the best people-watching place on Earth!
Monorail	The Las Vegas Monorail (formerly MGM Grand-Bally's Monorail) is a 6.3 km monorail mass transit system located on the Las Vegas Strip. The single fare is \$5. I like it as an effortless and safe way of moving from one end of town to the other.
Motorbiking	Book a Harley-Davidson Motorcycle Rental on Expedia and cruise the Las Vegas Strip on a late-model Harley-Davidson. Your ride comes perfectly equipped for touring, including unlimited mileage and a self-guided map for exploring the scenic back roads.
Helicopters	From the boisterous crowds of scintillating Las Vegas to the utter serenity of the bottom of the Grand Canyon in just 45 minutesCulture shock doesn't get any more shocking than this! Although the Grand Canyon looks close to Vegas on the map, it's a grueling 12 hours return drive – not including time on the Rim. Maverick Helicopters has the solution: we experienced their "Wind Dancer"



	tour on my last visit to Vegas which whirls you across the Mojave Desert, over Lake Mead and the Hoover Dam and gently deposits you close to the floor of the Grand Canyon for a few precious, breath-taking minutes of open-mouthed wonder.
	Joel was our expert pilot and guide in Maverick's uber-cool ECO-star helicopter - air-conditioned, quiet, comfortable and with great wraparound glass windows. He popped the champagne in celebration as we tried to take in the full majesty of this natural wonder of the world. There was no sign of another human being to be seen anywhere as the potent Colorado River – its colour living up to its name – roiled its restless, ruddy waters below us. If you're in Vegas – just do it. And do it with Maverick, as they're the only VIP helicopter company in Vegas, and you want to do something as

Car Rental	If you are just staying in Vegas, then you probably will have no need for a rental car. However, if you want to see the desert scenery, the mountains, the dams and more, then car rental is both easily available and very good value in Las Vegas. Consider booking this before you travel with Expedia at www.expedia.ca
Buses	There is an efficient and good value bus system operating in Las Vegas which can be a lifesaver in the hotter months. The Regional Transportation Commission (RTC) recently launched a service called The Deuce (www.rtcsouthernnevada.com/deuce), a fleet of modern double-decker buses that run the length of the Strip into downtown and near the airport. A one-way ride is \$2 for adults, \$1 for seniors 62 and older and children 6 to 17, and free for those under 6. For a remarkably low \$5, you get an all-day pass that lets you get on and off as many times as you like and also lets you ride all the other RTC buses all day. Exact change is required.
Passes	Las Vegas PowerPass from \$99 per adult with Expedia: Save money with the Las Vegas PowerPass. Get free or discounted admission to many of the most popular attractions in Sin City with the Las Vegas PowerPass. You'll skip the lines, and get a free guide.

TYPES If there's one thing Vegas has, it's hotels. Big hotels. And lots of them. You'll find 9 of the 10 largest hotels in the United States - 8 of the top 10 in the world - right here. And you'll find a whole lot of rooms: 140,000 of them. Every 5 minutes, or so it seems, someone is putting up a new giant hotel or adding another 1,000 rooms to an existing one. So finding a place to stay in Vegas should be the least of your worries. Except...when a convention, a fight, or some other big event is

happening - and these things are always happening - nearly all of those 140,000 rooms are going to be sold out. Over the course of a regular



year, the occupancy rate for hotel rooms in Las Vegas runs at about 90%. A last-minute Vegas vacation can turn into a housing nightmare. If possible, plan in advance so that you can have your choice: Ancient Egypt or Ancient Rome? New York or New Orleans? Strip or Downtown? Luxury or economy? Vegas has all that and way too much more.

Hotel prices in Vegas are anything but fixed, so you will notice wild price ranges. The same room can routinely go for anywhere from \$60 to \$250, depending on demand. So go to our friends at www.expedia.ca to see where the best deals are when you want to go.

The massive new **CityCenter** contains not just a 4,000-room megaresort and casino and all that goes with it (shops, restaurants, clubs), but also two 400-room boutique hotels (one being a part of the ultraluxe Mandarin Oriental chain), plus a couple thousand condo units and even more shopping, clubs, and restaurants separate from those belonging to the hotel complex. There are 7,000 rooms total, plus its own people-mover, which is just as well since CityCenter covers more than 60 acres. With a well over \$8 billion price tag, it's the largest privately funded construction project in U.S. history.

LIFESTYLES

Kids

Las Vegas may not be the first destination that comes to mind when thinking of a family-friendly vacation, but there are plenty of activities for children in the city. Around 10% of visitors are under 21. Most importantly, look for accommodations with a pool. Many Vegas hotels feature huge video arcades and diversions like roller coasters and other rides. The choices for shows and events have also diversified, and it is easy enough to find entertainment suitable for families.

In addition, children under 12 can often stay free in their parents' rooms, and well-priced buffets are ideal for families. Many hotels provide programs for children and teenagers, while babysitters and childcare facilities are also sometimes available. Inquire with your hotel. Visitors under the age of 21 are prohibited from drinking alcohol, loitering in casinos, and the Strip has a curfew. (Hotel security officers keep a keen eye out for anyone underage near any slot machines or table games.) Children under 18 are not allowed to be out after 9 p.m. unless accompanied by an adult.

It may also be a good idea to rent a car for your stay. Distances on the Strip can be deceiving, and a lot of walking is required to see everything.

Honeymoons & Weddings	From formal black-tie affairs to renewing vows in front of a rhinestone-studded Elvis impersonator, more than 122,000 couples obtain marriage licenses each year in Las Vegas, making it the marriage capital of the world. Neither blood tests nor waiting periods are required if you want to tie the knot. The legal age is 18 for both men and women (proof of age is required) and licensing fees are \$60. Civil ceremonies can be performed at the Marriage Commissioner's Office at 309 S. 3rd St. Chapel fees vary depending on the services provided. For marriage license information call the Clark County Marriage License Bureau (702) 671-0600, 201 Clark Avenue (located on the northwest corner of Clark Avenue and Third Street). Marriage License Bureau hours are 8 a.m. to midnight, including holidays. You can get married in Vegas even if you're not a U.S. resident. Most countries require a certified copy of your marriage certificate (\$10) and an apostille from the Nevada Secretary of State (\$20). Contact home country's Consulate office located in the U.S., to inquire if additional certifications are required. Special Needs	Las Vegas has more accessible guest rooms than any other city in the country. Hotels offer rooms with roll-in showers, transfer showers, and tubs with built-in or portable seats. For swimming pools, many Las Vegas hotels have lifts to assist you getting in and out. You may also find a beach entrance. Take time to talk to the reservation operator



	about your specific requirements, or if you need additional details, ask for the hotel's ADA Coordinator.
	Showrooms, Lounges and Restaurants Most of the larger hotels have assistive listening devices for the hearing-impaired available at the showroom or lounge entrance. Wheelchair seating is also available in most restaurants, lounges and showrooms, but call ahead for details.
	Gaming All hotels have accessible slot machines and many have sit-down table games and room for wheelchair users. Gaming personnel are generally trained in assisting vision and hearing-impaired persons to play the table games. If you need a sign language interpreter for the gaming schools offered at many of the casinos, please ask in advance. Most bingo rooms have Braille cards and large-print cards. A few larger rooms have electronic bingo for blind players or those with hand dexterity problems.
Seniors	Depending upon what you are looking for in Vegas, this can be a wonderful destination for Seniors. With more flexibility in when to travel, Seniors are best placed to pick up the widely varying bargains that Vegas offers in certain weeks of the year.

Golf	Vegas has been a favored golf destination since the early '50s and '60s, with championship-caliber 18-hole courses right on the Strip. Mild weather, clear blue skies, spectacular views of the Strip and the surrounding mountains make Las Vegas the ideal choice for a golfing holiday. With more than 60 courses in the Vegas area catering to every skill level and budget, there's no shortage of options. With moderate daytime temperatures, fall, winter and spring are the high seasons for golf in Las Vegas. Early-morning or late-evening play will help you beat the heat of summer, when you can also enjoy lower green fees. Here's a few suggestions:



Casablanca Golf Club

For a unique desert golf experience, this championship course offers rolling terrain, forgiving fairways, water hazards and natural sand dunes.

Aliante Golf Club

Northeast/North Las Vegas | Public & Resort

Aliante is a challenging course stretching more than 7,000 yards from the back tees. A meandering arroya comes into play on 14 holes.

Bear's Best - Las Vegas

Jack Nicklaus' playing career speaks volumes. He's also been designing golf courses for over 30 years. He has course designs on six of the seven continents.
